NOTE 1: Effective from 1st Jan 2014, cells or batteries shipped under the provisions of Section IB must be declared on a Shipper's Declaration

NOTE 2: A document must be attached to the package mentioning: "Handle with care. When package is damaged can cause fire. Special procedures should be followed, inspect the package and arrange repack by qualified persons when required. Contact Nr: 00XX XXXX XXXX XXX ". A Shipper's Declaration for Dangerous Goods is not required for Section II.

This document is required for any shipment where the lithium battery handling label is required (i.e. Section IB and Section II).

NOTE 3: If there are less than/equal 4cells/2 batteries contained in equipment then "Lithium metal batteries in compliance with Section II of PI970 (4 cells/2 batteries or less)" must be added in the nature and quantity of goods box of the air waybill for all shipments to/from/within Asia Pacific Region.

NOTE 4: Packages complying with the Section II of the different PI's must be marked: "PRIMARY LITHIUM BATTERIES — FORBIDDEN FOR TRANSPORT ABOARD PASSENGER AIRCRAFT"

(US only) or "LITHIUM METAL BATTERIES — FORBIDDEN FOR TRANSPORT ABOARD PASSENGER AIRCRAFT."

Packages complying with Section IA or IB of PI 968 must be labeled with the CAO label, even if under the limits of PAX. Documentation must be made accordingly (See USG 02)
